The Canberra Bushwalking Club, founded in 1961, is a 350 member club of outdoor enthusiasts.

While bushwalking is the club's main focus, a wide range of activities other than bushwalking are also organised within the club.

Trips are mostly day or overnight weekend trips, however numerous extended trips occur each year. A typical weekend will have two overnight trips and two day trips of varying difficulty.

These trips often venture into some of Australia's most spectacular wilderness areas. Popular destinations include:

- Namadgi National Park
- Morton National Park
- The Budawangs
- Deua National Park
- Kosciuszko National Park
- The Blue Mountains

Club members have also arranged trips to more remote regions of the world, such as:

- The MacDonnell Ranges
- Tasmania
- New Zealand
- Vietnam
- Sabah
- South America

All levels of capability are catered for, from beginner to advanced tiger walker. A reasonable level of fitness is expected of all members.

The trips are coordinated and lead by experienced, voluntary leaders with a strong emphasis on safety.

Instruction and advice is available for those who need it.

Transport on club trips is arranged via a car pool and costs are equally shared amongst all participants.

The club's monthly magazine, *It*, contains the upcoming program and other useful information.

An abridged version of the club activity program is available on the Club web site and prospective members are encouraged to try out a club trip.
